AUTODIDACTIC SELF-TAUGHT

JIM PARKINSON, Advocate for Literacy for Youth, Published Author

President Tom said he knew Jim when he was a prestigious partner and trial attorney in a law firm in Indio, CA. Brett introduced his father, Jim Parkinson as a retired attorney who now provides valued counsel to Brett's firm. But Jim's real passion is providing guidance and motivation for kids to take responsibility for their own education through literacy. Jim is on a literacy campaign and travels the world lecturing high schools. Jim returned from Tanzania and is going to Kenya next week to lecture. Jim has written several books and gave everyone in the group a copy of one of them titled "Autodidactic Self-Taught". Jim talked about the Rotary and how much good they are doing throughout the world. Jim has worked with Rotary Clubs in Tanzania, and has participated in Rotary projects in East Africa and has met with Rotary community leaders throughout the world.

The real problem in this country is illiterate or alliterate (can read, but choose not to) kids. Only 38% of high school seniors read at grade level. That number may be much less due to misreporting. There is presently a pending lawsuit in Atlanta, GA where some instructors are accused of doctoring test results so that they can get bonuses for high performing kids. Jim showed a film (starring Jim Parkinson) titled "Literacy for the 21st Century". The film is dedicated to inspiring students to take responsibility for their own education. Jim says "today decides tomorrow". After the film Jim discussed the flux in which the U.S. education system has been operating. Things like teaching phonics or whole words, new math or old math, collaborative learning or "no child left behind" or "race to the top", smaller classrooms vs larger classrooms (according to Jim studies show class room size has little effect on learning.



Jim's goal is to get in front of as many high school students as possible and spread his message of taking responsibility for their own success through word mastery. For more information go to: www.indioparky.com
