November—Rotary Foundation Month

It's Rotary Foundation Month! What are you doing to promote the programs and projects of The Rotary Foundation? What are you doing to increase giving to The Rotary Foundation so that we can do even more good in the world?

Yesterday, I spoke to the Rancho Bernardo Rotary Club. In preparing my remarks for their meeting, I was struck by how well-balanced this club is in relation to The Rotary Foundation.

Since their inception in 1964, they have donated roughly \$450,000 to the Annual Fund, matching grants, global grants, polio eradication and the Permanent Fund. Pretty impressive for a club of 57 members. Last year they averaged \$270 per person to the Annual Fund and it looks like they will exceed that amount this year substantially.

I said that they are well-balanced so let me tell you what else they have done. Since 2001, they have led or participated in TRF grants in six countries on three continents with a total value exceeding \$550,000. When I

asked who had visited the countries where the projects took place, members affirmed that every project country had been visited.

These projects have been in each of the six areas of focus as well.

Take a look at what your club is doing and ask yourself if your club is in balance.

Do your members donate generously to The Rotary Foundation?

Do your members actively participate in grants funded by The Rotary Foundation?

If not, now is the time to make that happen. It's Rotary Foundation Month. The perfect time to turn more of your Rotary Club members into Rotarians through The Rotary Foundation.

End Polio Now Update

As of 29 October, Rotarians have raised a total of US\$5.4 million has for 2012-13.

On 24 October we celebrated World Polio Day in recognition of the tremendous progress being made in the fight to end polio forever. There was a significant spike in media coverage and online conversation about polio eradication.

We launched the World's Biggest Commercial to support polio eradication, an online campaign that engaged the general public by inviting them to add a photo of themselves alongside Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Bill Gates, and others participating in Rotary's "This Close" campaign. Visit www.endpolionow.org, to be included in the constantly expanding commercial.

Together, in a single day, we reached a potential 29 million fans via social networks. You can lend your voice to the public conversation by sharing the message and asking their fellow Rotarians, elected officials and members of their local communities to support this historic global public health initiative and help End Polio Now.

Hopefully, the checks will be in the hands of our clubs shortly, deposited and spent on the wonderful worthwhile projects that were identified in the applications.

Of course, we'll want the reporting done shortly after that!

There was a slight delay due to very recent

changes in the laws of India which prevents us from sending funds directly to India.

We have asked the two clubs that had proposed projects in India to provide us with a different proposal. They will have until January 1 to come up with a different project for their district grant funds.

If they do not identify a project, we will open up those funds to qualified Rotary Clubs that did not submit a project on the September 1 deadline.

And if there are no applications, the funds will be transferred to our global grant fund account.

The district grant funds have been distributed to our Foundation Mentors for presentation to the clubs.

Global Grants



At the October meeting of the District Rotary Foundation Committee, we awarded District Designated Funds to four projects in Ecuador, Uganda, Columbia and Ken-

ya. These grants are in four of the six areas of focus.

The \$39,086 of DDF will contribute to the four grants whose project budgets exceed \$193,000.

We will have another opportunity for clubs to apply for DDF in January. All projects must have a complete proposal and be fully funded for consideration.



DOING GOOD IN THE WORLD!

From the Foundation Trustee Chair Wilf Wilkinson

As the clock ticks down to 1 July, we are in the final stages of preparing for the full rollout of the Future Vision Plan. Our goal is simple: enabling our Foundation to continue Doing Good in the World, and ensuring that we make the best use of every dollar, euro, yen, and peso that we have.

In everything we do in Rotary, we strive for the greatest impact. This means focusing on sustainability—on projects whose effects will go on for years, and on work that will continue to change lives even after Rotarians' involvement has ended. When polio is eradicated, every child who will ever be born will

benefit, long after the last drop of vaccine has been put into a child's mouth. PolioPlus is, of course, a unique Rotary program—but it is time to bring that kind of long-term perspective to all our service.

Part of our goal in Future Vision is making sure that we focus on the long view in everything we do. Accordingly, part of that mindset is making sure that we make it a priority to support The Rotary Foundation and its Annual Fund. Our goal is Every Rotarians, Every Year: for every Rotarian to give a fit each year to the Annual Fund, with an average donation of US\$100. Meeting that goal would

mean \$120 million per year for Rotary service. IT would also mean an organization in which every single member is supporting, and is invested in, the Foundation's success—making The Rotary Foundation truly Our Foundation.

(Editor's Note: District 5340 last year donated an average of \$146.03 for each Rotarian. Thank you so much for your generosity.)
