Frequently Asked Questions



What is Rotary Direct?

<u>Rotary Direct</u> (formerly known as TRF-Direct) is The Rotary Foundation's recurring giving program. Select an amount, frequency (monthly, quarterly or annually), and contribution method. You can set up recurring gifts to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus and the Areas of Focus. You can learn more from the <u>Rotary Direct Information Guide</u>.

Why sign up for Rotary Direct?

Save time, money & lives by signing up for Rotary Direct. This is the most efficient method for ensuring that your contributions go directly to The Rotary Foundation resulting in faster processing and achievement of your club and personal charitable goals. This convenient method minimizes work for you and your club leadership by setting your own schedule of contributions that count toward your Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society, and Major Donor recognition, as well as your club recognition banners.

How do you sign up?

- (1) Web: Once registered in <u>Member Access</u>, Rotarians can contribute at <u>www.rotary.org/contribute</u>. The recurring option is presented in Step 2 of the contribution process under the section titled "*Frequency."
- (2) Handout: Donors may enroll using the <u>Rotary Direct (USA)</u> or <u>Rotary Direct (Canada)</u>
- (3) Contribution Form: Donors may enroll using <u>The Rotary Foundation Contribution Form</u> (123) by checking the frequency box (monthly, quarterly or annually) under section "3. Contribution Details- Make this a recurring contribution."
- (4) **Phone:** Donors may enroll over the phone with the Contact Center by calling +1-866-976-8279 or +1-866-9ROTARY.

What are the frequency options available for Rotary Direct gifts?

If you choose to make a recurring contribution, you will be registering to make a gift every month, quarter, or year on the 1st of the month. Note: Processing of quarterly donations occurs in July, October, January, and April. For annual contributions, you may choose the processing month.

Can I enroll using a checking account (direct debit) arrangement?

Individuals can enroll in Rotary Direct by using a debit card linked to a checking account.

How do I change my method of payment, amount or stop Rotary Direct contributions?

To make changes to your account, please call +1-847-866-3066 or email <u>rotarydirect@rotary.org</u>. For security reasons, please notify us by telephone to change or update your credit card information.

Where can I get a list of Rotary Direct participants for my district?

The Rotary Foundation is in the process of adding a notation on the EREY Eligibility Report and Club Recognition Summary so you can identify the Rotary Direct participants in your club. Please note that these reports do not include contribution amounts due to Rotary's confidentiality and privacy policies.

PAUL HARRIS SOCIETY



1. What is the Paul Harris Society?

The <u>Paul Harris Society</u> is a recognition program for Rotarians and friends of <u>The Rotary Foundation</u> who personally contribute US \$1,000 or more to the <u>Annual Fund</u>, <u>PolioPlus Fund</u> or an approved Foundation grant each year. Contributions to the <u>Endowment Fund</u>) and <u>Disaster Recovery</u> Funds are <u>not</u> eligible for Paul Harris Society membership.

2. What do your contributions support?

Your contributions support a wide range of <u>humanitarian</u> and <u>educational</u> activities <u>around the world</u>.

3. What is the recent Trustee decision about Paul Harris Society?

The Trustees of The Rotary Foundation have adopted the Paul Harris Society as an official recognition program of The Rotary Foundation effective 1 July 2013. The Rotary Foundation will begin providing consistent recognition material, reporting, tracking while increasing marketing and district support for the Paul Harris Society program. The administration and operations plans are still being developed.

4. How do you get help from the Foundation to track Paul Harris Society eligibility?

(a) The Contact Center (<u>contact.center@rotary.org</u>) provides the following reports:

- (i) The <u>EREY Eligibility Report</u> is a **club tool** to identify potential members that lists PHS eligibility for the current and previous Rotary years.
- (ii) The donor history report provides individual donors with their own Paul Harris Society eligibility for the current and previous Rotary year. You can use the <u>Contribution and Recognition Reports User Guide</u> for assistance in running this report in <u>Member Access</u>.
- (iii) The Paul Harris Society Eligibility Report is a district tool to identify potential members that lists Paul Harris Society eligibility for the current and previous two Rotary years.
- (iv) The Recognition Report by Individual (Paul Harris Society Eligibility) is a district tool that lists potential members and the date they achieved their last PHS eligibility. There are two additional tabs with this excel report that includes mailing address information (which can be used for mail merges).

5. Who provides the recognition items for Paul Harris Society members?

The 2013-14 Paul Harris Society recognition will be provided by The Rotary Foundation. The administration and operations plans are still being developed.

6. Can I set up automatic giving to The Rotary Foundation to fulfill my Paul Harris Society membership?

Through <u>Rotary Direct</u>, Rotary's recurring giving program, you can set up automatic contributions through your credit card or direct debit card online. Sign up through <u>Member</u> <u>Access</u>, by completing the Rotary Direct Handout <u>USA</u> <u>Canada</u> or over the phone with the Contact Center by calling +1-866-976-8279 or +1-866-9ROTARY.

ROTARY FOUNDATION SUSTAINING MEMBER

A Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member is an individual who personally contributes US\$100 or more each year to the Annual Fund. These contributions also count toward Paul Harris Fellow, Multiple Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society, Major Donor, and club recognition. Contact your Rotary club president to obtain the annual Sustaining Member badge sticker in appreciation of this achievement. Use the <u>EREY Eligibility Report</u> to see the Rotary Foundation Sustaining Members in your club.

PAUL HARRIS FELLOW

Paul Harris Fellow recognition is given in appreciation to anyone who contributes (or in whose name is contributed), a gift of US\$1,000 or more cumulatively to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, or an approved Foundation grant. The recognition consists of a certificate and pin. Other optional items include a <u>medallion (PHF)</u> for \$15 and a complimentary <u>Certificate Cover</u> (PHCEN). Use the <u>Club Recognition Summary</u> to see the list of Paul Harris Fellows in your club.

CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION

Occasionally, a donor contributes US\$1,000 and wishes to recognize a business or organization. In these instances, a Certificate of Appreciation is given instead of Paul Harris Fellow recognition, which is only for individuals.

MULTIPLE PAUL HARRIS FELLOW

Multiple Paul Harris Fellow recognition is extended at subsequent US \$1,000 levels. Recognition consists of a pin with additional stones corresponding to the recipient's recognition amount. Use the <u>Club</u> <u>Recognition Summary</u> to see the list of multiple Paul Harris Fellows in your club. US\$2,000 to 2,999.99 - one sapphire 3,000 to 3,999.99 - two sapphires 4,000 to 4,999.99 - three sapphires 5,000 to 5,999.99 - four sapphires 6,000 to 6,999.99 - five sapphires 7,000 to 7,999.99 - one ruby 8,000 to 8,999.99 - two rubies 9,000 to 9,999.99 - three rubies


PAUL HARRIS SOCIETY

The Paul Harris Society recognizes individuals who contribute US\$1,000 or more each year to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, or an approved Foundation grant. Paul Harris Society contributions count toward Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member (Annual Fund contributions only), Paul Harris Fellow, Multiple Paul Harris Fellow, and Major Donor recognition. Use the EREY Eligibility Report to see the eligible Paul Harris Society members in your club.

Club Banner Recognition Opportunities



To request a copy of the **Annual Fund Banner Recognition Status Report** from the Foundation, e-mail <u>contact.center@rotary.org</u>. This report displays a club's current Rotary year progress towards becoming an Every Rotarian, Every Year Club, a 100% Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member Club and the Top Three Per Capita in Annual Fund Giving banner recognition. Banner recipients listed in this report may fluctuate throughout the Rotary year due to changes in membership and additional or redistributed contributions. Final certification is processed by The Rotary Foundation following the close of the Rotary year.

EVERY ROTARIAN, EVERY YEAR CLUB

This banner is awarded to clubs that achieve a minimum US\$100 per capita giving and 100 percent participation with every active (dues paying) member contributing some amount to the Annual Fund during the Rotary year. This annual banner recognition is awarded at the conclusion of the Rotary year. Use <u>EREY Eligibility Report</u> to determine if your club will qualify for this recognition.

100% PAUL HARRIS FELLOW CLUB

To be eligible, every active (dues-paying) member of the club must be a Paul Harris Fellow at the time banner recognition is requested*. In addition to the banner, the club's name is included on the <u>list of 100% Paul Harris Fellow Clubs</u> available at www.rotary.org. This one-time only banner recognition is awarded throughout the Rotary year. Use <u>Club Recognition Summary (CRS)</u> to determine if your club will qualify for this recognition.

*To obtain this recognition:

- 1. A club representative must contact the district governor after determining that all current, dues-paying club members are Paul Harris Fellows
- 2. The district governor must confirm that all members are Paul Harris Fellows and notify The Rotary Foundation by emailing <u>APF@rotary.org</u>

100% ROTARY FOUNDATION SUSTAINING MEMBER CLUB

Rotary clubs must achieve a US\$100 per capita and **every** active (dues paying) member of the club must personally contribute \$100 or more to the Annual Fund during the Rotary year. This annual banner recognition is awarded at the conclusion of the Rotary year and is based on active membership as of 30 June. Use <u>EREY Eligibility Report</u> to determine if your club will qualify for this recognition.

TOP THREE PER CAPITA IN ANNUAL FUND GIVING

Banners are given to the top three per capita giving clubs in each district. To be eligible, clubs must achieve a minimum US\$50 per capita in *annual giving*. This banner recognition is awarded at the conclusion of the Rotary year. Use the **Annual Fund Banner Recognition Status Report** to determine if your club will qualify for this recognition.

UNDERSTANDING FOUNDATION RECOGNITION POINTS



What are Foundation recognition points and how are they accumulated?

Foundation recognition points are awarded to donors who contribute to The Rotary Foundation through the <u>Annual Fund</u> or <u>PolioPlus Fund</u>, or as a sponsor portion to a Foundation grant. Donors receive one Foundation recognition point for every U.S. dollar contributed to these funds. Contributions to the <u>Endowment Fund</u> are *not eligible*.

Donors can extend Foundation recognition points to others to help them become or to name them as a Paul Harris Fellow or Multiple Paul Harris Fellow. Foundation recognition points belong to the original donor until the donor's death, or until the donor uses the points (the surviving spouse of a Major Donor may also use the points).

How do you transfer Foundation recognition points?

A minimum of 100 Foundation recognition points must be transferred at a time, and an authorizing signature is required when completing the <u>Recognition and Transfer Request</u>.

- Individual donors are the only ones authorized to transfer Foundation recognition points from their individual account.
- Club presidents are the only ones authorized to transfer Foundation recognition points from the club's account.
- District governors are the only ones authorized to transfer Foundation recognition points from the district account.

Foundation recognition points may not be transferred from individuals to a club or district.

Can Foundation recognition points of deceased Rotarians be transferred?

No. Foundation recognition points of deceased Rotarians expire unless the deceased is a <u>Major</u> <u>Donor</u>, in which case, the spouse/partner maintains control of the Foundation recognition points during their lifetime.

Can a business or organization become a Paul Harris Fellow?

No. Paul Harris Fellow awards are issued only to individuals. However, businesses and organizations can be recognized for contributions of US\$1,000 or more with a Certificate of Appreciation.

Can someone deceased become a Paul Harris Fellow?

Yes. A donor can recognize a deceased individual by requesting a Memorial Paul Harris Fellow.

Do Foundation recognition points count toward Major Donor recognition?

No. Only cumulative personal outright contributions count toward Major Donor recognition.

What report tracks Foundation recognition points?

Through <u>Member Access</u>, your club and district leadership can view the <u>Club Recognition</u> <u>Summary</u>, which provides the recognition amount, Foundation recognition points, current Paul Harris Fellow level, and date that Paul Harris Fellow level was achieved. Through <u>Member Access</u>, you can view your personal contribution history, recognition amount, and available Foundation recognition points. You can request a copy of your **Donor History Report** from the Foundation at <u>contact.center@rotary.org</u>.

On the Club Recognition Summary, what is the difference between recognition amount and available Foundation recognition points?

Recognition amount reflects all Paul Harris Fellow recognition an individual has accumulated through their personal contributions plus all Foundation recognition points given to the individual by other individuals, clubs, or districts. Foundation recognition points given to an individual do *not* count toward Major Donor recognition, and the maximum amount that can be shown on the <u>Club Recognition Summary</u> report is 9,000 (the "+" sign indicates that the actual amount exceeds the 9,000-point maximum).

Available Foundation recognition points reflects points that a donor has accumulated through personal outright giving to the Foundation. All points listed can be transferred to other individuals to help them achieve additional Paul Harris Fellow recognition.

Can clubs or districts accumulate Foundation recognition points?

Yes. Clubs can view recognition points in the Club Recognition Summary.

District Foundation recognition points are shown in the **Donor History Report.** Districts may request the report at <u>contact.center@rotary.org</u>.

How can I use Foundation recognition points to increase giving to the Foundation?

Matching outright contributions with Foundation recognition points may help your club reach or even surpass its Annual Fund goal, as well as achieve 100% Paul Harris Fellow recognition.

To determine whether your club is close to achieving 100% Paul Harris Fellow status, review the recognition amounts of all active Rotarians in the <u>Club Recognition Summary</u> who are currently listed as active club members.

To determine whether you're close to achieving your Annual Fund goal, review the <u>Monthly</u> <u>Contribution Report</u>.

What recognition opportunities are available with Foundation recognition points?

Paul Harris Fellow

Paul Harris Fellow recognition is given in appreciation to anyone who contributes, outright or cumulatively (or in whose name is contributed), a gift of US\$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, or the World Fund, or as a sponsor portion of a Foundation grant. The recognition consists of a certificate and pin. In addition, <u>Paul Harris Fellow medallions</u> can be ordered at <u>shop.rotary.org</u> for \$15 each. Use the <u>Club Recognition Summary</u> to see a listing of the Paul Harris Fellows in your club.

Certificate of Appreciation

Occasionally, a donor contributes US\$1,000 and wishes to recognize a business or organization. In these instances, since Paul Harris Fellow recognition can only be presented to individuals, a Certificate of Appreciation is given instead.

Multiple Paul Harris Fellow


Multiple Paul Harris Fellow recognition is extended at subsequent US\$1,000 levels (\$2,000, \$3,000, and so on). Recognition consists of a pin with stones corresponding to the recipient's recognition amount level. Use the <u>Club Recognition Summary</u> to see a list of Multiple Paul Harris Fellows in your club.
