General

**The Rotary Foundation Reference Guide (219):** Booklet provides a brief overview of Rotary Foundation programs (including the Annual Fund and SHARE, Permanent Fund, PolioPlus Fund, Rotary Peace Fellowships, Grants, Rotary Foundation Alumni, Recognition and Foundation Awards)

**Every Rotarian, Every Year (957):** Give to all club members to encourage their participation and contribution to the Annual Fund (primary source of funding for broad range of local and international Foundation activities). Contains an appreciation/contribution form.

**Your Rotary Legacy (330):** Explains why you would want to include Rotary in your estate plans and how you can do it. Includes a response card, recognition information, and a donor story.

**End Polio Now (940):** Use this flyer to spread the word about Rotary's commitment to polio eradication.

**PolioPlus Advocacy Flier (943):** Use this flyer to give Rotarians and friends of Rotary information they need to help End Polio Now.

**End Polio Now Fundraising Toolkit (999):** Features a 30-minute excerpt from the film, "The Shot Felt 'Round the World," an inspiring new story about Jonas Salk, the developer of the first polio vaccine. It also includes a short video on Rotary's efforts to eradicate the disease along with an animated video from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and Rotary's "This Close" public service announcement.

**Peace is Possible (850):** The booklet provides an overview of the Rotary Peace Centers, highlights several accomplished Peace Fellows, and explains opportunities available to donors to support the program.
